

Kirsteen Shields has held the post of Lecturer at the School of Law, University of Dundee since 2010 where she teaches Public Law and International Human Rights Law. Her doctoral research began at Queen Mary, University of London in 2006 as part of an inter-institutional AHRC (UK Arts and Humanities Research Council) research project on the law and economics of the Fairtrade Movement. As part of this research she travelled to Bolivia, South Africa and Cuba to undertake comparative fieldwork with agricultural workers in relation to their labour conditions. This research lay the groundwork for further exploration into the relationship between law structures and global inequality and this is Kirsteen's primary research area at present. Parallel to her doctoral research Kirsteen has interned for UNESCO, researched for Liberty human rights organisation and volunteered for A4ID (Advocates for International Development), lectured at SOAS, University of London and Birkbeck, University of London and held the post of Fellow in Human Rights at LSE Centre for the Study of Human Rights until 2010. In 2011 she was awarded the title of Scotland and Northern Ireland Young Thinker of the Year.
