**Application Guidelines (Fall 2019 Admissions)**

**1. Introduction**

Please read the following Application Guidelines before submitting an application.

In 1994, the Graduate School of Law at Kyushu University established Japan's first Master's level program taught entirely in English: the LL.M. program in International Economic and Business Law (*IEBL*). Drawing upon faculty members with particular strengths in these fields of law, the *IEBL* program is designed to provide both Japanese and international students with the ability to confront the many challenges of contemporary international economic affairs and commercial transactions. Taught in English from a Japanese perspective, the *IEBL* program seeks to develop a critical understanding of economic and legal principles within the framework of international & comparative law.

**2. Program Duration**

The *IEBL* is taught on a full-time basis and takes 12 months for completion, beginning in October every year and ending in early September of the following year.

### 3. Admission Requirements

For admission to the *IEBL*, applicants must meet the following requirements:

1. A degree in Law from an accredited university.
2. A good command of English. A TOEFL score of 580+ (paper-based), or 92+ (Internet-based) or equivalent is required for non-native English speakers.
3. Sufficient financial support for the duration of the program. Further details on the costs of studying for the *IEBL*, including tuition and other fees, are available at the program web site.

### 4. Application Materials

Applicants are requested to submit by registered airmail or equivalent (i.e. Federal Express, DHL etc.), **an original and one copy** of the following documents to the Faculty of Law, Kyushu University **before January 11, 2019** (applications arriving after that date cannot be accepted):

1. Completed ***IEBL* Application Form**. Please note: (1) It is very important that the name that you include in Section 1 of the Application Form is the same as the name in your passport. The Student Visa of successful applicants will be issued with the name provided in Section 1, and it can cause problems at immigration when entering Japan if the names are different. (2) Nationality. You must indicate if you have dual nationality or Japanese nationality.
2. A photocopy of **Graduation Certificate** of the last university and graduate school attended, OR a **Certified Letter** from the university at which the applicant is currently attending, stating the expected graduation date.
3. **Official School Transcript** of the last school from which the applicant graduated and that which the applicant is currently attending.
4. **Two Letters of Recommendation** from the Dean, the applicant's supervising professor or other teaching staff who have had direct contact with the applicant; or from a supervisor in the employing body with personal knowledge of the applicant (forms attached below). If you want a Japanese Government Scholarship, one Letter of Recommendation must be from the Dean.

5. For non-native speakers, **proof of English proficiency** must be provided. A TOEFL score of 580+ (paper-based), or 92+ (Internet-based) or equivalent is required for non-native English speakers.

All application materials should be typed **in English** on the attached forms or additional sheets of A4 paper. In the event materials required above are in a language other than English or Japanese, a translation into one of these languages must be attached.

Application materials will **not** be returned to applicants.

### **5. Application Procedure**

Question 6 of the *IEBL* Application Form asks whether an applicant wishes to receive a Japanese Government Scholarship.

Section 6 below describes the conditions of eligibility for the scholarship.

The application procedure is different depending on whether you are applying for a Japanese Government Scholarship or not:

#### ***i. Applicants NOT wishing to receive a Japanese Government Scholarship***

After receiving the application Kyushu University **MAY** decide to hold an interview.

Interviews will be held either by Skype, phone or (if it is convenient) in person in mid-January 2019.

Applicants will be informed of the result of their application to the *IEBL*, by mid-March 2019.

#### ***ii. Applicants wishing to receive a Japanese Government Scholarship***

After receiving the application, Kyushu University **MAY** decide to hold an interview.

Interviews will be held either by phone, Skype or (if it is convenient) in person, in mid-January 2019.

If the *IEBL* Admissions Committee decides to award a scholarship, the applicant will be informed immediately after the interview.

A student who has been awarded a scholarship will then be required to submit the Japanese Government Scholarship Application Form and supporting materials. This form will be provided to all successful candidates by e-mail.

The completed Scholarship Application Form must be submitted before **January 31, 2019**.

Successful candidates who are **not** interviewed by phone, Skype or in person will be required to complete a brief “e-mail interview” in mid-January 2019.

Formal confirmation of a place on the program and the award of the scholarship will be informed to the candidate by mid-March 2019.

## **6. Conditions of Eligibility for the Japanese Government Scholarship**

To be eligible for a Japanese Government Scholarship, a candidate must meet **all** of the following conditions:

- (1) **Nationality:** Applicants must be citizens of a nation recognized under the foreign scholarship program of the Japanese Ministry of Education, and be resident in that nation until they come to Japan after they are awarded the scholarship. Anyone holding Japanese nationality is not eligible to receive a scholarship.
- (2) **Education:** Applicants must hold a Bachelor’s degree in Law from an accredited University. In the event that they are currently studying law at a university, graduation should take place before October 1, 2019 in order to be eligible.
- (3) **Age:** All applicants must be under 35 years of old as of April 2, 2019. i.e. Any candidate born before April 1, 1984 is not eligible for a Japanese government scholarship. Exceptions may be made to this age restriction depending on individual circumstances, such as compulsory military service or loss of educational opportunities caused by war or other situation. If you wish to seek an exemption,

please send a written inquiry to the Admission Office of the *LL.M.* Program explaining your particular circumstances.

- (4) **Military personnel** are not eligible for this scholarship if they remain on active duty.
- (5) **Other financial support:** Persons already receiving financial support from their home government or other funding organization are ineligible for a Japanese government scholarship.
- (6) **Arrival in Japan:** In principle, applicants must be able to arrive in Japan during the period specified by the accepting university, i.e., two weeks before the first day of the course conducted by the accepting university. If the applicant cannot arrive in Japan during the specified period for personal reasons, travel expenses to Japan will not be paid.
- (7) **Already enrolled as a Student, etc.** Those who are already enrolled in a Japanese university or other institution with a residence status of “Student” (留学) or who are going to enrolled, or plan to enroll, in a Japanese university or other institution as a privately-financed international student from the time of application to the MEXT scholarship program in the applicant’s country until the commencement of the period for payment of the MEXT scholarship may not receive the scholarship. However, this stipulation does not apply to privately-financed international students, who, even though they are enrolled, or are planning to enroll, in a Japanese university, verifiably complete their studies before the start of the scholarship payment period, return to their home country at the time of the scholarship application, and newly acquire the “Student” residence status and come to Japan.

## 7. Warning

(1) Successful applicants will have their enrollment at Kyushu University withdrawn immediately in the event of **any** of the following:

- If the applicant is found to have made false statements on his/her application.
- If the applicant is subject to disciplinary measures or has been found to have no promise for academic achievement by the University.
- If the applicant is absent from University for a prolonged period of time without

permission.

- If the student has insufficient resources to finance their studies in Kyushu University.

(2) Japanese Government Scholarships for the 2019-2020 *LL.M.* Program have not been finally confirmed. The Ministry of Education is expected to confirm them by the beginning of December 2018. We will provide final confirmation of the scholarships on the program home page:
