Application Guidelines (Fall 2018 Admissions)

1. Introduction

Please read the following Application Guidelines before submitting an application.

Kyushu University's *LL.D.* program offers students the unique opportunity of preparing a doctoral thesis in English whilst studying at a Japanese university. Participants will pursue a closely supervised program of research prior to submitting a final dissertation.

The program is designed to provide students with the skills necessary to complete high-level research in law.

2. Purpose of Program

Kyushu University's *LL.D.* program offers students the unique opportunity of preparing a doctoral thesis in English whilst studying at a Japanese university. The program is designed to provide students with the skills necessary to complete high-level research in law.

Participants will pursue a closely supervised program of research prior to submitting a final dissertation.

3. Subject Areas for Doctoral Dissertation

The doctoral thesis may be on any law-related subject agreed in consultation with the academic supervisors and approved by the *LL.D. Faculty Committee*.

4. Admission Requirements

For admission to the *LL.D.* program, applicants must meet the following requirements:

1. A Master's degree (in law or a related discipline) from an accredited university. All applicants are expected to have engaged in some form of law study at graduate level.
2. A good command of English. A TOEFL score of 250+ (computer-based), 600+ (paper-based), or 100+ (Internet-based) or equivalent is required for non-native English speakers.
3. Sufficient financial support for the duration of the program. Further details on the costs of studying on the *LL.D.* program, including tuition and other fees, are available at the program web site.

5. Application Materials

Applicants are requested to submit by registered airmail or equivalent (i.e. Federal Express, DHL etc.), **an original and one copy** of the following documents to the Faculty of Law, Kyushu University **before December 22, 2017** (applications arriving after that date cannot be accepted):

1. Completed **LL.D. Application Form** (form attached below). Please note: (1) It is very important that the name that you include in Section 1 of the Application Form is the same as the name in your passport. The Student Visa of successful applicants will be issued with the name provided in Section 1, and it can cause problems at immigration when entering Japan if the names are different. (2) Nationality. You must indicate if you have dual nationality or Japanese nationality.
2. A photocopy of **Graduation Certificate** of the last university and graduate school attended, OR a **Certified Letter** from the university at which the applicant is currently attending, stating the expected graduation date.
3. **Official School Transcript** of the last school from which the applicant graduated and that which the applicant is currently attending.

4. **Two Letters of Recommendation** from the Dean, the applicant's supervising professor or other teaching staff who have had direct contact with the applicant; or from a supervisor in the employing body with personal knowledge of the applicant (forms attached below). If you want a Japanese Government Scholarship, one Letter of Recommendation must be from the Dean.

5. For non-native speakers, **proof of English proficiency** must be provided. A TOEFL score of 250+ (computer-based), 600+ (paper-based), or 100+ (Internet-based) or equivalent is required for non-native English speakers.

6. A copy of any Master's thesis that has been written in English, a substantial piece of written work in English OR - if the student is currently enrolled on an *LL.M* program at Kyushu University - a 20 pages draft of the *LL.M.* thesis.

All application materials should be typed **in English** on the attached forms or additional sheets of A4 paper. In the event materials required above are in a language other than English or Japanese, a translation into one of these languages must be attached.

Application materials will **not** be returned to applicants.

6. Application Procedure

Question 6 of the Application Form asks whether you wish to receive a Japanese Government Scholarship. Section 7 below describes the additional conditions of eligibility for the scholarship. All interested applicants should check carefully that they are eligible.

The application procedure is different depending on whether you are applying for a Japanese Government Scholarship or not:

i. Applicants NOT wishing to receive a Japanese Government Scholarship

After receiving the application Kyushu University may decide to hold an interview.

Interviews will be held either by SKYPE, phone or (if it is convenient) in person in mid-January 2018.

Applicants will be informed of the result of their application to the *IEBL*, by mid-March 2018.

ii. Applicants wishing to receive a Japanese Government Scholarship

After receiving the *LL.D.* Application Form, Kyushu University may decide to hold an interview.

Interviews will be held either by phone, Skype or (if it is more convenient) in person, in mid-January 2018.

If the *LL.D.* Admissions Committee decides to award a scholarship, the applicant will be informed **by the end of January 2018.**

A student who has been awarded a scholarship will then be required to submit the Japanese Government Scholarship Application Form. This form will be provided to all successful candidates by e-mail.

The completed Scholarship Application Form must be submitted before **January 31, 2018.**

Formal confirmation of a place on the program and the award of the scholarship will be informed to the candidate by mid-March 2018.

7. Conditions of Eligibility for the Japanese Government Scholarship

To be eligible for a Japanese government scholarship, an applicant must meet all of the following conditions:

- (1) **Nationality:** Applicants must be citizens of a nation recognized under the foreign scholarship program of the Japanese Ministry of Education, and be resident in that nation until they come to Japan after they are awarded the Scholarship. Anyone holding Japanese nationality is not eligible to receive a scholarship.
- (2) **Education:** Applicants must hold a Bachelors degree in Law from an accredited University. In the event they are currently studying law at a university, graduation should take place before October 1, 2018 in order to qualify.
- (3) **Age:** All applicants must be under 35 years of old as of April 2, 2018. i.e. Any candidate born before April 1, 1983 is not eligible for a Japanese Government Scholarship.

- (4) **Military personnel** are not eligible for this scholarship if they remain on active duty.
- (5) **Other financial support:** Persons already receiving financial support from their home government or other organization are ineligible for this scholarship.

8. Warning

(1) Students will have their enrollment at Kyushu University withdrawn immediately in the event of **any** of the following:

- If the applicant is found to have made false statements on his/her application.
- If the applicant is subject to disciplinary measures or has been found to have no promise for academic achievement by the University.
- If the applicant is absent from University for a prolonged period of time without permission.
- If the student has insufficient resources to finance their studies in Kyushu University.

(2) Japanese Government Scholarships for the 2018-2021 *LL.D.* Program have not been finally confirmed yet. The Ministry of Education is expected to confirm them by the end of November 2017. 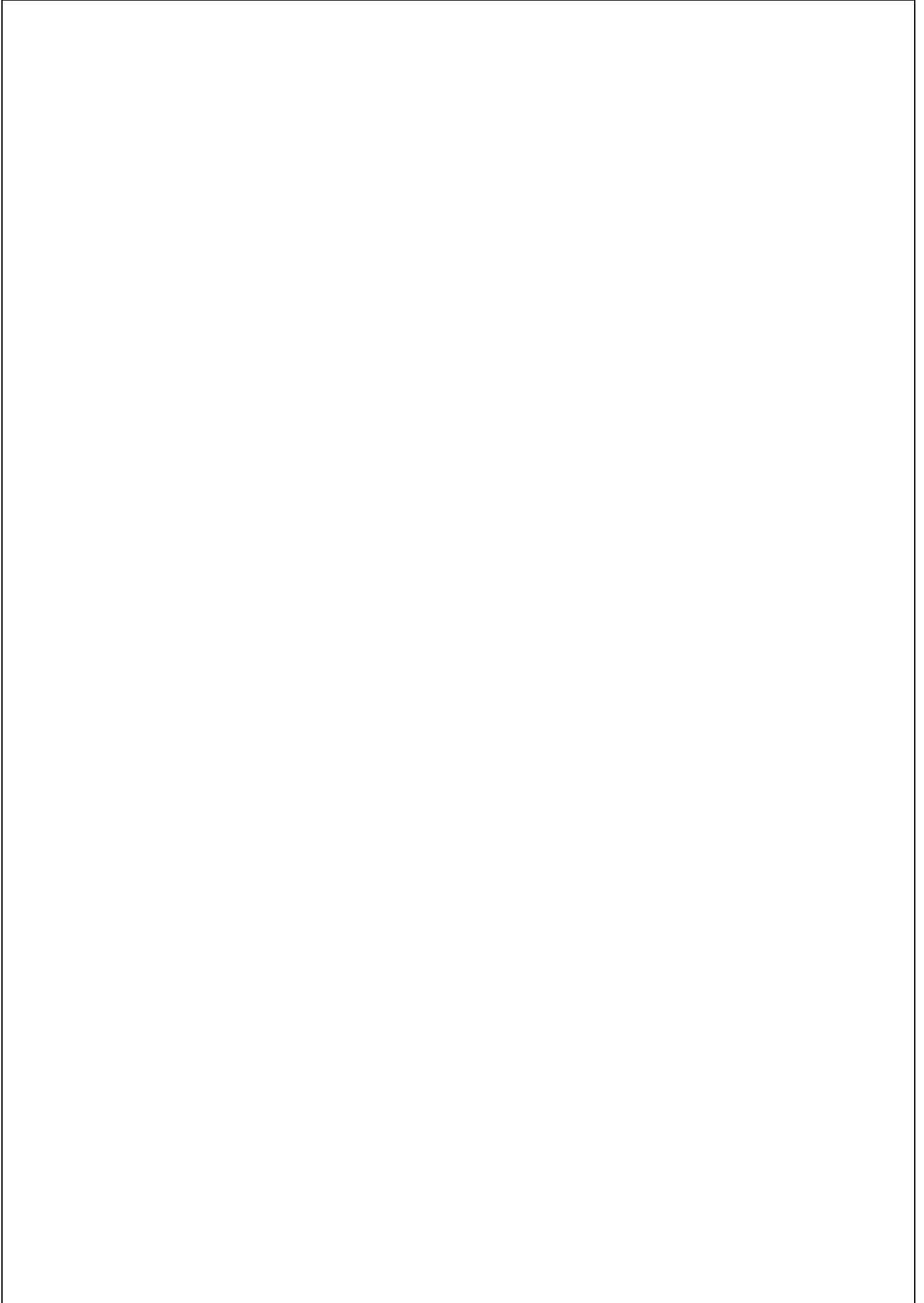
